REMINDERS

WHAT WE ARE LEARNING

Math - Review of key math concepts including pi, area, number operations, fractions, decimals and percentages, and area. Students have submitted their JUMP Math books for assessment, and have overall, made very good progress this year.

Reading - We have finished our cross-curricular study of "Red Wolf" by Jennifer Dance, as our novel study this term. Students are compiling a vintage newspaper based on events from the novel, and have completed their book reviews.

Writing - Students have completed their survival stories, created a newspaper, engaged in editing and proofreading their work for spelling and grammar errors. The school-wide write topic this month is: fractured fairytales (literary writing).

ADST - Students will present their Genius Hour projects to the class.

Science - Students presented their Green Island climate change projects to the class, and did a great job of planning and implementing plans for a sustainable living space for 1000 people.

Social Studies - The Ancient World to the 7th Century - Interactions and exchanges between past civilizations and cultures, including conflict, peace, trade, expansion, and migration. Careers - Demonstrating leadership and entrepreneurial skills through collaborative activities in the school and community including a class hike to Shane Lake, and fund-raising activities.

Health - Examining a variety of issues and decisions about personal health, (including physical activity, healthy eating practices, relationships, bullying and discrimination, sleep, hygiene and substance abuse) and examining how media and peer influences can influence their decisions.
