October 16: We have Huble Homestead coming into our class for a presentation on Lheidli T'enneh. It will focus on the broader effects of European contact as Canada became increasingly populated with settlers, and uses the Lheidli T'enneh as a primary example. Students will be introduced to the culture of the Lheidli T'enneh and discuss their traditional territory and their daily life in the early 1900s. Students will engage in a fur trading activity to illustrate the impact of different European goods on the Lheidli T'enneh's life style.

October 31: Our class will be having a Halloween party. Students are welcome to dress up, and we'll enjoy some Halloween-themed activities and snacks. For those who do not celebrate Halloween, alternate schoolwork will be provided.
