WHAT WE'RE LEARNING THIS MONTH

MATH: We will continue strengthening our multiplication facts to support accuracy and fluency. We will also be continuing our unit on operations with whole numbers. We will be focusing right now on multi digit division.

LANGUAGE ARTS: We will be starting our poetry and figurative language unit, where students will explore imagery, metaphors, similes, and sensory writing. We will also begin our next novel study, *Touching Spirit*

Bear, focusing on comprehension and discussion skills. Students will continue developing their writing through structured activities that build strong vocabulary and expressive detail.

SCIENCE: We will be beginning our unit on the endocrine system. Students will learn about different glands, the hormones they produce, and how these hormones help regulate growth and body functions. This unit will include diagrams, hands-on activities, and opportunities to connect what they learn to real-life examples.

SOCIAL STUDIES: We will be starting our unit *Let's End Poverty*, which explores the causes and impacts of poverty locally and globally. Students will learn about global citizenship and consider how individuals and communities can take action to promote fairness and justice. This unit encourages thoughtful discussion and helps students understand their role in creating positive change.

RELIGION: We will be learning about the role of the Sacraments and how they help us grow in our faith. Students will explore the meaning and purpose of each Sacrament, and how these special moments connect us to God and to our church community. We will also continue to participate in daily prayer and reflect on how we can live out our faith in our actions.

Career: We will be learning about the importance of contributing to our community and how small actions can make a meaningful difference. Students will explore what it means to be responsible, engaged citizens both inside and outside of school. Through discussions and activities, they will reflect on ways they can use their strengths to positively impact others.

Health: We will be beginning our unit on substance misuse prevention and learning how to make safe, informed choices. Students will explore the effects of substances on the body and discuss strategies for handling peer pressure and risky situations. Our focus will be on building confidence, awareness, and healthy decision-making skills.
