Safety and Communication

My top priority is to ensure your child enjoys a safe learning environment.

Learning Philosophy



The philosophy in Grade 5 is built around developing a growth mindset. Having a growth mindset means believing that a person's abilities aren't innate but can be improved through effort, learning, and persistence. A growth

mindset is all about the attitude with which a person faces challenges, how they process failures, and how they adapt and evolve as a result. Everyone has the ability to learn but it takes practice, determination and hard work. This is what it means to have a growth mindset. Secondly, learning is a consequence of thinking and students in Grade 5 are always prompted to 'think'.

My job is to provide an environment in which each child can learn and to provide the support they need to be successful.

Homework

Homework is not meant to be an end in itself, it supports the learning happening in the classroom. Homework will be assigned each night but not on weekends except in situations where a student has not used the time given during the week to complete assignments. I would not expect any child in Grade 5 to ever spend more than an hour on homework on any given evening – if that is happening please let me know and we can see what is going on. If there isn't a specific homework assignment, students should spend time reading, reviewing number facts, practice typing, or do some review of concepts covered that week, etc.

Basic Skills Practice



Never let your child tell you they don't have any

homework!!!!! If I have not assigned homework or your child has completed their work at school I want them to spend some time each evening on the basic skills of reading and numeracy (recall of math facts such as adding, subtracting, and multiplication).
